

## **Safety Covid-19 guidelines for Skydiving**

In line with recent U.K. Government guidance, Skyline airfields in England are now carrying out a phased restart of Skydiving activities. There are a number of measures that are being implemented in order to allow for this return to be as safe as possible for all participants, spectators, staff, instructors and additional measures at some Dropzones. All participants will be contacted before their jump by Skyline and made aware of the requirements they will be expected to follow on the day.

Anyone who has experienced COVID-19 symptoms, or has been in close contact with someone who has experienced symptoms in the last 14 days, will be asked not to attend the dropzone. Anyone who has been advised by NHS track & trace to self-isolate should also stay at home. We are also advising people who are over the age of 50, or have been determined as either Clinically Vulnerable, or Extremely Clinically Vulnerable to the Coronavirus by the NHS not to participate in Skydives yet. In all of these instances participants will be able to reschedule their jumps at no extra cost.

### **What about Scotland and Wales?**
