MSA Trust Raising Awareness Grants Terms and Conditions

These terms and conditions outline the conditions for approving a raising awareness grant from the MSA Trust.

In cases of a grant refusal or appeal, these should be referred to the Head of Fundraising and their decision is final.

- Grants will not exceed the value of £200 (per grant) and will be approved by the Events, Community and Digital Fundraising officer, Head of Fundraising and one CEO.
- 2. Grants will be considered on an individual basis and the majority will be given an amount under £200.
- 3. The project will be shared widely across our social media channels, website, newsletter and magazine. By accepting a grant, the recipient consents to having the details of your project publicised.
- 4. If your project includes or involves others, you must obtain their permission and ensure they are aware that their story may be shared across MSA Trust's digital platforms and in our quarterly magazine.
- 5. The MSA Trusts raising awareness grants programme is to help cover the cost of **project expenses** that have been incurred by the recipient.
- 6. All information shared about Multiple System Atrophy in talks or published materials (e.g., blogs, books) is accurate and verified using our 'The work of the MSA Trust' poster, website, published factsheets, or the NHS website.
- 7. They must live in the UK, Republic of Ireland, Isle of Man or Channel Islands.
- 8. The person must have a registered bank account in one of the above locations which they authorise us to make payment to.
- 9. We may request receipts as proof of purchase for any equipment, travel or accommodation expenses covered, or evidence that the project has been completed, such as photos or a case study.
- 10. If the project is not completed, we reserve the right to request the return of the full grant, including any unused funds.
- 11. No more than one grant will be paid per year, per recipient
